

Considerations for the MAC OS X version

Important: Before installing a new version, the old version should be uninstalled, see the final chapter of this guide for instructions.

Prerequisites for Lumikit SHOW on MAC OS X

For the correct operation of the Lumikit SHOW, the X11 software (window manager) must be installed. If X11 is not installed Lumikit SHOW will not open when running, to install X11 just download the installer at <https://www.xquartz.org/>

Installing Lumikit SHOW on MAC OS X

a) Drag the "Lumikit SHOW 5.0" icon to the "Applications" folder;



b) Inside the "Applications" folder, execute "Lumikit SHOW 5.0";

c) Depending on the version of your MAC the "unidentified developer" message may appear:




In this case, access the MAC preferences, look for "security". Open the "Security and Privacy" icon:




Click the "Open Anyway" button:




Again the message below will be displayed, just click "Open":




d) It will take a few minutes the first time the software runs, and the following message will be shown:



If the software does not open or show this message, it may be necessary to execute a manual installation script, in the .ZIP file that was downloaded from the site there is a file called "repair.command", double click to execute:



Again the message "developer not identified" will be shown, follow the instructions in item "c" and execute the file with the "Open anyway" button:



When executing the script, the Administrator password must be entered:



After running the Lumikit SHOW should work normally.


Uninstalling Lumikit SHOW on MAC OS X

The Lumikit SHOW at the time it is installed uses other folders to save information, so just dragging the icon to the Recycle Bin will not completely remove the Lumikit SHOW. To do total removal follow the steps:


a) in the "Finder" menu, "Go", select "Go to Folder ...":



b) type "~ / Library":



c) Enter the "Application support" folder and then browse for folders starting with "com.lumikit.show"



Removing these folders (dragging to Trash for example) Lumikit SHOW will be totally removed from MAC.
